579	Lipodystrophy	Peake, Sarah K. (HOU)	Requires private insurers, MassHealth, and GIC to provide medical treatment for lipodystrophy, a disfiguring side effect of lifesaving, but highly toxic HIV medication
671	Adult Basic Education	Koczera, Robert M. (HOU)	Additional \$6M to meet existing needs of ABE to assist adult learners enhance reading writing and math skills in preparation of the GED and transition to a job, college, or training program
684	RMV Learner's Permit	Hecht, Jonathan (HOU)	require that the learner's permit written examination always include at least one question that tests how to interact safely with cyclists and pedestrians
694	to increase food assistance	Decker, Marjorie (HOU)	Increases funding for the Cambridge Backpack Food Assistance program
756	updating state disability standard	Decker, Marjorie (HOU)	Requires DTA to review and update its medical standards for determining the eligibility of certain disabled individuals for TAFDC benefits in order to ensure consistency with current medical knowledge.
800	Massachusetts Food Trust	Donahue, Daniel M. (HOU)	Earmarks \$500,000 for the Massachusetts Food Trust Program to provide loans, grants, and technical assistance to support new and expanded healthy food retailers and local food enterprises in low and moderate income communities.
845	Charter School Reimbursement for Cities, Towns and Regional School Districts	Ultrino, Steven (HOU)	Increases funding for Charter School Reimbursements to \$134,365,223.

938	Mentoring Matching Grants	Pignatelli, William Smitty (HOU)	Appropriates additional \$200,000 for statewide, competitive grants for youth mentoring programs
942	HIV/AIDS Services	Fox, Gloria L. (HOU)	Increases line item to \$35,220,000 for human immunodeficiency virus and acquired immune deficiency syndrome services and programs and related services for persons affected by HIV/AIDS
964	Demonstration Workforce Development Program	Keefe, Mary (HOU)	New \$2,000,000 pilot program for prison-to-career transitions
973	Department of Environmental Protection Administration and Compliance	Rogers, David (HOU)	Increase to 1 million over FY16: 30,520,620.
990	Safe and Supportive Schools	Balsler, Ruth B. (HOU)	Appropriates \$575,000 for school districts to develop safe and supportive programming to address the behavioral health needs of students.

(HOU)	Increases funding to the Office of Oral Health as well as the Forsyth Institute's Center for Children's Oral Health in order for it to expand its ForsythKids programming focused on children and adolescents and to explore the emerging association between oral health status and academic performance
1103	Early Education and School Age Rate Reserve	Scibak, John W. (HOU)	Increases Early Education Rate reserve to \$20,000,000
1113	Extraordinary Medical Release	Toomey, Timothy J. (HOU)	allow for the extraordinary medical release of certain terminally ill and permanently incapacitated inmates in the state and county corrections systems
1115	Comprehensive Family Planning Services	Fiola, Carole A. (HOU)	Increases funding for comprehensive family planning services to \$6,300,000
1119	Health Safety Net Eligibility & Funding	Barber, Christine P. (HOU)	Increases funding for health safety net from 15M to \$30M (section 42). Replaces study language with language that health safety net will continue as it currently exists. Essentially maintains eligibility and funding for Health Safety Net program
1127	School-to-Career Connecting Activities	Peisch, Alice Hanlon (HOU)	Increases funding for School-to-Career Connecting activities to \$5,450,138 and dictates that the program shall partner with Youthworks to develop connections between the two programs
1232	Charter School Tuition Reimbursement	Malia, Elizabeth A. (HOU)	Increases reimbursements to communities with charter schools by \$10 million to \$95 million
1234	Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Services/RISE	Malia, Elizabeth A. (HOU)	Earmarks roughly \$3 million for state-wide services for domestic violence survivor programming
1242	DCR State Parks and Recreation	Schmid, Paul A. (HOU)	Makes line item for DCR State Parks and Recreation to \$50 million
1245	Plumbers' Apprentice Unemployment	Scibak, John W. (HOU)	Expands the regulations for apprentices to receive unemployment benefits
